After winning \$200,000 in February, Hill said he had hoped to purchase a new vehicle and put what was leftover into savings. This time around, the winner said he has one main plan.

Hill purchased his winning ticket from the Circle K located at 2515 Highlands Road W in Lethbridge. He won his second major prize of the year by matching all five cards drawn on the May 14 nightly draw – the Queen of spades, four of clubs, seven of clubs, Ace of diamonds and seven of diamonds.
